The Red Rubber Ball Foundation is a social enterprise providing opportunities, encouragement and guidance for young people to live the life they want.

Our projects are based around education - the building block to helping families move on in life + escape poverty.

The backbone of our activities are **Scholarships** – providing children who could not otherwise do so, with an opportunity to complete their schooling.

This is enhanced by **Mentoring**, and further opportunities are provided through a **Field Centre farm** and a **Cycling Club**.

The red rubber ball family is a movement of young people, supporters, volunteers, mentors, who share and live by a common philosophy. It is this philosophy that makes the difference.
